“He called them.”



What did Jesus actually say to James and John when he “called them” (Mark 1:20)? Did he just approach them, as he did with Simon and Andrew, and say, “Come after me” (1:17)? Or was there a longer, more involved conversation? Whatever happened, we know that this encounter had a powerful effect on these two fishermen. They “left their father Zebedee in the boat along with the hired men and followed him” (1:20).

How did Jesus call you? It doesn’t matter whether it happened at a specific point in time or over many years. What matters is that like these first disciples, Jesus called you and you chose to follow him.

The first call we hear is Jesus calling us to himself. He is the One who shows us the way to the Father and who fills our hearts with his love, mercy, and grace. As it did for these disciples, our relationship with our Lord becomes the foundation for our life and for everything else we do.

Jesus also calls us to mission. Whether we are called to marriage and family, to the priesthood, or to the religious or single life, we are all given a mission, a specific way he wants us to serve him. He may even call us to be missionaries like the first disciples.

But we can also receive multiple callings in our lives, and our calling can change or expand over time. Maybe in one season of life, we are called to focus mainly on the needs of our family. In another, God might be asking us to spend more time meeting the needs of our brothers and sisters, perhaps by teaching the faith or caring for the poor.

Spend some time at Mass today thanking Jesus for the ways he has called you. It’s not always easy to say yes—we know that following Jesus will inevitably involve hardships as well as joys. But there is no greater honor or privilege we could ever hope to have!

Fun Facts about Catholics and Coffee

Capuchin Cappuccinos

What do friars and coffee have in common? The beloved frothy beverage known as a “cappuccino” takes its name from the brown habits worn by Franciscan friars. The Italian word for their cowl, or hood, is *cappuccio*.



Coffee's Patron Saint



Of the Week

Bl. Laura Vicuña

Patron of Abuse Victims and a model of chastity, obedience and humility

Feast Day: January 22

Laura Vicuña was born in Santiago, Chile on April 5, 1891 to a poor family. Her father, Jose Domingo, was a professional soldier and her mother Mercedes was a seamstress. When Laura was still a baby revolution broke out in Chile. Laura's father took part in suppressing it. After the defeat of the government army, he settled down with his wife and daughter in Temuco, near the border with Argentina. There he died in 1893. After his death Mercedes gave birth to a daughter, Julia. Mercedes could not find a job and walked with her daughters across the mountains into Argentina. There she became the common-law wife of Manuel Mora, a farmer who had a bad reputation. In times of poverty and turmoil, no one was surprised by such an informal relationship. In 1901 Mercedes sent her daughters to a boarding school run by the Salesian sisters. Despite her young age, Laura was concerned about her mother's actions.

Life for mother's happiness

At school Laura learned the story of Dominic Savio and following his example, she made vows of love of God, mortification and chastity, and offered her life for her mother's conversion and happiness. When she fell ill, her mother brought her to Mora's farm. The farmer, a heavy drinker, maltreated Mercedes and wanted to seduce her daughter. However, Laura managed to keep her virginity, but she was brutally beaten. The injured girl found solace and shelter in the Salesian boarding house. She was a model of obedience and humility for others, she took care of the youngest girls with love and devotion, and she often practiced mortification. However, her health started to deteriorate, and good care and treatment did not help. She died on January 22, 1904 at the age of 13. After her death, her mother broke up with Mora and returned to the Church.



John Paul II beatified Laura on September 5, 1988.
