Today is a day of great joy and celebration. That’s because Jesus Christ, who suffered a cruel death and rose from his tomb, is now risen in glory. And now that you are “raised with Christ,” he invites you to enter into his joy (Colossians 3:1).

You may feel full of joy today. But what if you don’t? What if you feel weighed down by worries and burdens? There is still a way that you can experience Easter joy.

How? By faith.

As St. Paul writes in today’s second reading, “Think of what is above” (Colossians 3:2). By faith, you can recall that God loves you, that he is with you, and that he has won the victory over death and sin—including all of *your own* sins! Scripture promises that “there is no condemnation for those who are in Christ Jesus” (Romans 8:1). That’s you! “When Christ your life appears, then you too will appear with him in

glory” (Colossians 3:4). That’s you!

Recalling these truths can lead you into another experience of Easter joy: the joy of serving the Lord and his people. Peter must have been overjoyed when Jesus told him, “Feed my lambs” (John 21:15). His failures and sins—even his denial of the Lord—had been washed away! Now he could participate in the mission of the risen Christ. As you serve Jesus today—by loving others, by sharing your faith, or by joyfully preparing a family meal—believe that, just like Peter, you are also participating in Jesus’ mission. And that is a true and certain path to joy.

Easter joy is not just about gathering for Mass or enjoying a feast or wearing a special outfit—you know that! It comes about through faith and service, and it can last all year long. So set your heart on “what is above” today (Colossians 3:2). Then hear Jesus say, “Come and share in my joy!”

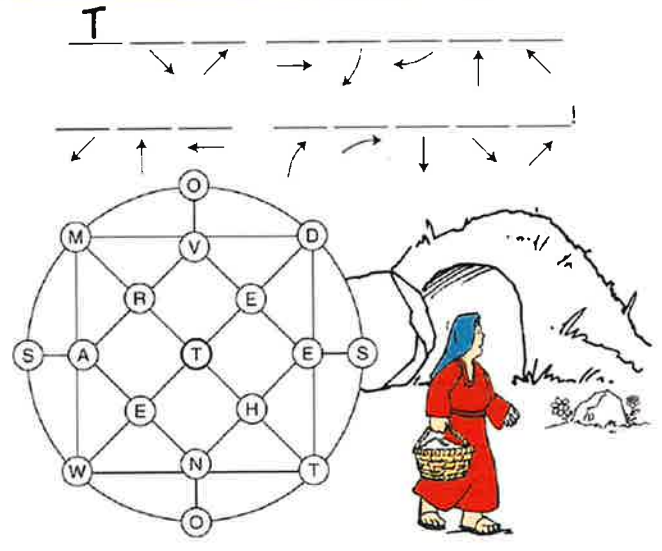

Jesus Is Resurrected

What does the word “Alleluia” mean?

What exactly are we saying when we exclaim, “He is risen! Alleluia”?

Alleluia is the well-known proclamation of Easter joy. All through Lent we haven’t seen or spoken a single syllable of the word, but now it bursts forth everywhere we look.

The word comes to us from the Jews—it was their cry of praise to God. It is often used in the Psalms.

In Hebrew, *Allelu* is an exclamation reserved for divine praise meaning “All hail” or “Glory in the highest.” *la* refers to God Himself, “Him Who Is.”

Allelu-ia, therefore, means “All hail to Him Who Is” or even—roughly—“Glory to God in the highest.”

When Catholics adopted the phrase, it soon became very important in the Liturgy and Office.

It is always removed during Lent because of its joyful character, and returns with the great celebrations of Easter:

During Eastertime it is the characteristic Paschal note of varying parts of Mass and Office, constantly appearing at the beginning and end, and even in the middle, of psalms, as an instinctive exclamation of ecstatic joy.

The Gospels recount how those who encountered Christ when he walked the dusty roads of Galilee had their lives changed forever.

People are still coming face to face with Jesus, and his presence continues to convert sinners. Only this time his disciples are gazing upon him in the form of bread, contained in a gilded vessel placed on an altar.

“Nonbelievers will tell you you’re wasting your time, and you have to explain to them, ‘I actually believe that piece of bread there has been mystically transformed into the body and blood of Jesus. There is a reality there,’” said Michael Schmidt, 30, of El Paso, Texas.

“Modern society can be very superficial, but there is nothing superficial about going to church and sitting or kneeling for an hour in front of the Blessed Sacrament, because you couldn’t do that if you didn’t believe it,” Schmidt said. Whether he is praying the Rosary or reading a spiritual book, Schmidt said spending time with the Blessed Sacrament has changed his life for the better.

Of the Week

St. Benjamin

Deacon

Feast Day: March 31

Benjamin was martyred during the Christian persecutions in Persia under King Isdegerd. The anti-Christian campaign brought to a close a 12-year period of religious tolerance that the king himself had initiated. He had put an end to the years of cruel treatment Christians suffered during the reign of his father, King Sapor. All that changed, however, when a bishop named Abdas, in his zeal to rid Persia of idol worship, burned down the pagan temple of fire.

Incensed, Isdegerd threatened to do the same to the Christian churches unless the bishop rebuilt the temple. When Abdas refused, he was executed. Churches were burned and Christians tortured in horrible ways. Isdegerd died in 421, but the cruelty continued under the reign of his son, Varanes.

Allegiance to God

Deacon Benjamin was among those who suffered. He was imprisoned for a year for practicing his faith and endured countless tortures. The emperor of Constantinople succeeded in securing Benjamin's release by promising Varanes that, once freed, the deacon would not return to preaching. It was a pledge that Benjamin could not honor. Almost immediately, Benjamin took to the streets and began preaching openly wherever there were people to teach.

In 424, Benjamin was arrested again and brought before the king. Again, he was beaten and tortured, but he refused to be silenced, declaring his allegiance to God and his duty to preach the Gospel. The king then instructed his jailers to torture the deacon until dead. Benjamin died in terrible agony.

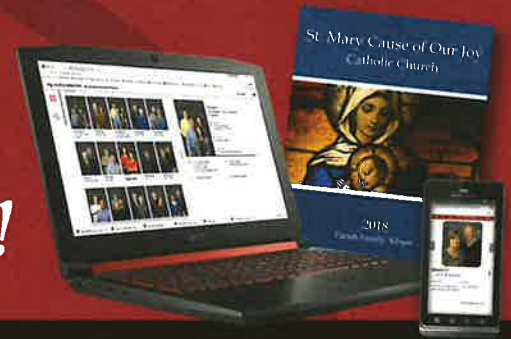
