

"He opened their minds."

What a traumatic three days the disciples had just been through—from the Last Supper through Gethsemane, Judas' betrayal, Jesus' arrest, and Peter's denial, all the way up to Jesus' Crucifixion! Everything they had staked their lives on had fallen to pieces—and they themselves had failed Jesus completely.

So it's no wonder that Jesus' first words when he appeared tt he disciples were "Peace be with you" (Luke 24: 36). How they needed that peace! Then, just as he had done for the disciples on the road to Emmaus, he "opened their minds" to help them make sense of all they had just been through (24: 45). Walking them through the Scriptures, he showed them how his death had been part of God's plan all along. He helped them see that it was not the end of all their hopes but the beginning of a glorious new future.

Have you ever felt the way the disciples



did? Maybe you're in the midst of a painful situation right now that has you feeling confused, betrayed, or lost. Maybe a traumatic experience in the past still haunts you. Or maybe the guilt of some past sin continues to weigh you down.

Whatever your situation, Jesus longs to do for you what he did for his disciples. He longs to open your mind to his mercy so that you can be set free from guilt or shame. He longs to reveal his love so that you can see your past—especially the painful parts—through his eyes of love and compassion. He longs to give you new insight into his wisdom so that you can look to your future with hope and trust.

Quieten your heart today so that you can hear Jesus speak to you. Let him "open your mind" and show you how he looks at you. Let him give you his peace.

Of the Week

Pope St. Leo IX

Bishop of Toul and Pope

Feast Day: April 19

In 1002, the future Pope Leo IX was born into a noble French family and named Bruno. He was educated at Toul, a city on the Moselle River, and became a canon at the local cathedral. In 1026, Bruno led part of Emperor Conrad II's army on an expedition to Italy and proved to be a brave military leader. While in Italy, the Bishop of Toul died, and the emperor subsequently appointed Bruno to succeed him.

or the next 20 years, Bruno worked hard to reform the Church in his diocese, especially stopping the buying and selling of Church offices and weeding out clergy who had broken their vows of celibacy. When Pope Damasus II died in 1048, Emperor Henry III nominated Bruno. Entering Rome dressed as a pilgrim, Bruno was crowned Pope Leo IX in 1049.

Reformer Pope

People Leo IX quickly convened a synod in Rome to continue the reforms he had started as bishop. Several bishops who had bought their offices were deposed and others were reconsecrated. Even though he had been named bishop and pope by the emperor, Leo IX fought against the appointment of churchmen by the politically powerful. A realistic reformed, Leo knew that his changes would not be effective if he merely issued orders, so he traveled extensively, visiting the far reaches of the Western Christian world to spread his message.

In 1053, Normans invaded Church-held lands, and Leo again led troops in battle. But they lost and Leo was arrested. Treated with respect, Leo was able to continue his papal work from Prison and sent ambassadors abroad to settle various Church disputes. When Leo became ill, he was returned to Rome, where he died in 1054.


