“Ask for whatever you want and it will be done for you.”



Have you ever heard of snake oil salesmen? They sell a product that they promise will solve all of our problems, cure all of our ills, and guarantee a happy life. It's a tempting offer. But we know deep down that the salesman's promises are empty.

In today's Gospel, Jesus tells us that we can come to him and ask for whatever we want. Does that mean that, like a snake oil salesman, he is promising to give us whatever we desire, even if it's riches, fame, or power? Not at all.

When Jesus makes this promise, he begins by saying "If you remain in me and my words remain in you" (John 15:7). That's the key: abiding in Jesus. He wants us to be like branches that are constantly fed and sustained by a vine. That means staying connected to him so that he can feed us and form us (15:5).

The closer we are to Jesus and the more

we let his words shape us, the more our hearts can become like his. Our desires and dreams start to reflect his desires and dreams for us. As a result, it's more likely that we'll be "asking" according to God's will.

Of course, this doesn't happen overnight. Even as we strive to align ourselves with God's will, we should still keep bringing our needs or desires to Jesus. We should always come to him with the confidence of children who trust in their loving father. After all, we have a good God who wants to give us good things. But in the end, prayer is not an exercise in trying to get *him* to bend to *our* will. It's a process of freely embracing his will.

Jesus is promising us that we can ask and receive as we align ourselves with him and hold onto his words. He himself will dwell within us and lead us to our heavenly Father. And that's not an empty promise!

What is Adoration?

The Catechism of the Catholic Church tells us that, "Adoration is the first attitude of man acknowledging that he is a creature before his Creator. It exalts the greatness of the Lord who made us and the almighty power of the Savior who sets us free from evil. Adoration is homage of the spirit to the "King of Glory," respectful silence in the presence of the "ever greater" God. Adoration of the thrice-holy and sovereign God of love blends with humility and gives assurance to our supplications." (CCC 2628).

Why is May the Month of Mary?

The tradition of dedicating the month of May to Mary came about in the 13th century. Some say because it was created to replace various pagan cults. The actual reason is the fact that this month is the time when spring is at the height of its beauty. Spring is also connected with nature renewing itself. In her way, Mary gave new life to the world when she gave birth to our savior, Jesus Christ.

The link between Mary and the month of May became popular among the members of the Jesuit Order—by 1000 it had a firm hold among their students at the Roman College and a short time later it was publicly celebrated in the Gesu Church in Rome. From there it spread to the rest of the Church.

The pious practice of honoring Mary during the Month of May has been especially promoted by the Popes. Pius XII made frequent reference to it and his great Encyclical *on the Sacred Liturgy Mediator Dei*. He characterized it as one of “other exercises of piety which although not strictly belonging to Sacred Liturgy, are nevertheless of special import and dignity, and may be considered in a certain way to be an addition to the liturgical cult: they have been approved and praised over and over again by the Apostolic See and by the Bishops.”

Devotion to Mary is an important part of the Catholic identity. As our mother she is an example of a committed “Yes” to the will of God. Because of the devotion to her many people ask her for help in the most difficult moments of their life as any child does with his mother.

Saint

Of the Week

Pope St. Pius V

Bishop of Nepi and Sutri,
Cardinal and Pope
Feast Day: April 30

The future Pope Pius V was born Antonio Ghisleri. At 14, he entered the Dominican order and took the name Michael. After his ordination, Michael taught for 16 years. He also took part in the Inquisition, which was the Church's attempt to save Catholicism as the Protestant Reformation spread across Europe. Michael showed great zeal for preserving traditional Catholic beliefs. In 1556, Michael was named Bishop of Nepi and Sutri, and the following year, he became a cardinal. His reputation as a reformer helped ensure his election as pope in 1566.

As Pius V, he immediately ended the extravagance that had sometimes marked the Holy See. He ate simple meals and used papal funds to benefit hospitals, convents and the needy.

Pius extended reform beyond Rome, ordering priests to live in their parishes and bishops to live in their sees. He also ended corruption within the orders and set up a formal system of catechism to be taught by local priests. At a time when Catholicism was under assault, Pius strengthened its foundation.

European Affairs

Pius took an active role in political affairs, trying to spread the Counter-Reformation. He supported Catholic monarchs and hoped to bring England's Queen Elizabeth back into the Catholic Church. When this effort failed, he excommunicated the Protestant queen.

In 1571, Pius organized a Catholic naval force that destroyed the Turkish fleet in the Gulf of Lepanto. The Pope's prayers and fasting during the campaign inspired everyone around him. Pius died the next year, and although he had served only six years as pope, he left a significant legacy to the faith he cherished.
