“God is Love.”



A statement like “God is love” can sound so abstract! But in today’s second reading, John follows up this revelation with a second one: God’s love is revealed to us in Jesus, who offered himself on the cross “so that we might have life through him” (1 John 4:9). And as Jesus tells us in today’s Gospel, we, too, are called to lay down our lives for one another out of love (John 15:13).

But unlike Jesus, we usually aren’t called to literally die for someone. So what does it actually look like to lay down our lives for another person?

Today’s first reading from Acts gives us a model. A Roman centurion named Cornelius invites Peter to come to his home in Caesarea, about a thirty-five-mile walk. Peter knows it is “unlawful for a Jewish man to associate with, or visit, a Gentile,” yet he goes anyway (Acts 10:28). When he begins preaching the good news to them, the Holy

Spirit falls on Cornelius and the rest of the people gathered there, and they are “baptized in the name of Jesus Christ” (10:48).

Peter was doing what Jesus had commanded when he said, “Love one another as I love you” (John 15:12). He was laying down his life for these former enemies by listening to the Spirit’s leading, taking the time to journey to Caesarea, entering the centurion’s house, and then going out on a limb to baptize Gentiles.

Each day we are presented with opportunities to lay down our lives for one another out of love. It might cost us our time or our energy. It might require courage, patience, or forbearance. We might have to step out in faith. But as we do these things—even those that seem routine or mundane—we are making the abstract truth that “God is love” into a living reality. We are revealing God’s love to the world.

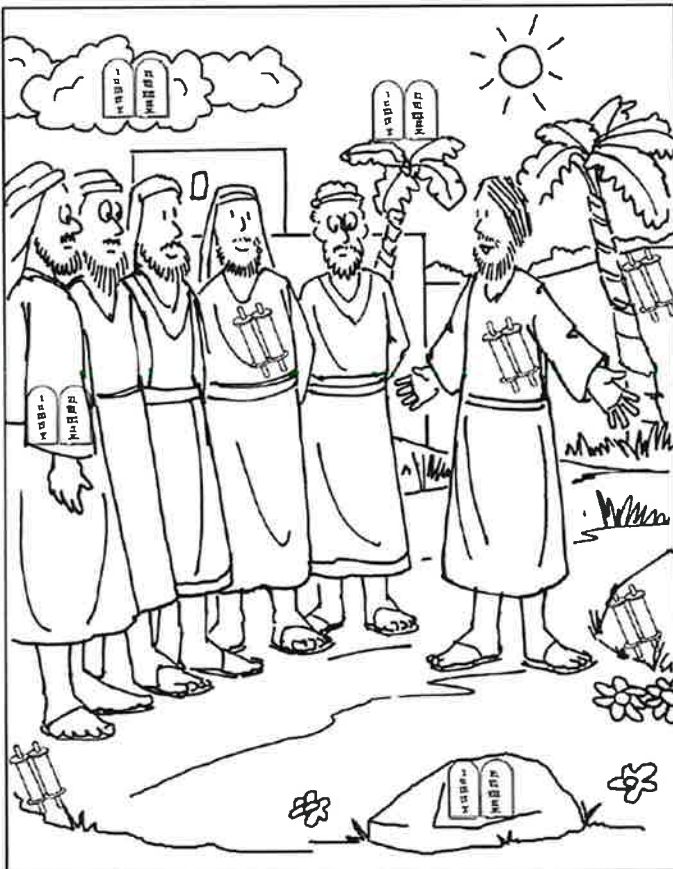

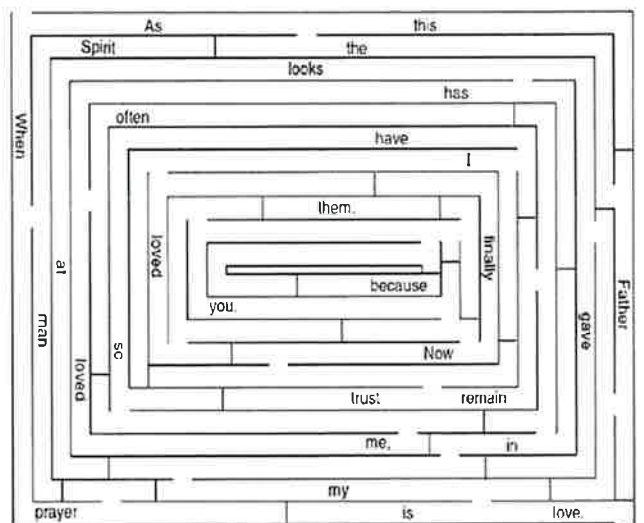

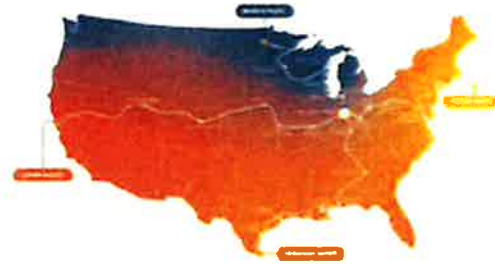

Of the Week

St. Edbert of Lindisfarne

Bishop of Lindisfarne

Feast Day: May 6

Edbert was a respected seventh-century biblical scholar and generous caregiver to the poor. All that is known about his life and service comes from Bede's *Ecclesiastical History*.

Edbert's story is closely associated with that of Cuthbert, Edbert's predecessor as Bishop of Lindisfarne, a small island off the coast of England. Lindisfarne was the first religious center for the region of Northumbria. In 688, Edbert was appointed its bishop and every year, he faithfully gave one-tenth of his property—grain, livestock, produce and clothing—to benefit the poor.

He also supervised a renovation of the wooden cathedral at Lindisfarne. To ensure that the beloved church would survive, Edbert had its simple thatched roof replaced with sheets of lead.

Edbert was quite fond of taking solitary retreats. Twice a year, during Lent and before Christmas, he went to a tiny island for 40 days of prayer and fasting, just as Jesus had done before He began His ministry.

A shrine at Lindisfarne

In 698, while Edbert was away on one of his retreats, he received amazing news. Before he had left, Edbert had given his monks permission to exhume Cuthbert's remains to use as holy relics. When the monks opened Cuthbert's coffin, they found his body and his burial clothe still intact. They brought some of the clothing to Edbert, who realized the extent of the miracle. He ordered Cuthbert's body to be enshrined at the cathedral. Edbert also told the monks to leave the old grave open as he would soon need a final resting place.

A short while later, Edbert passed away. Miraculous healing at his graveside led to Edbert's veneration.



O Jesus, following your example, Edbert set out alone for forty days of prayer, seeking the blissful solitude that would bring him even deeper into Your spirit.

Grant that I may find the time and place each day to devote my heart to You and renew my faith in the everlasting salvation You offer us all.

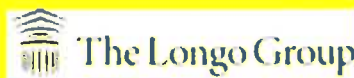
