***“We walk by faith,
not by sight.”***



Ruth was struggling with her teenage children. She loved them and prayed for them and set healthy boundaries for them, but their irritability and poor choices made her feel that she wasn't doing enough. Some days she even wondered if she was failing as a parent.

Then one morning she read this verse from St. Paul during her prayer time: “We walk by faith, not by sight” (2 Corinthians 5:7). As she read it, she felt a nudge from God to read it again. As she reflected on the things she was viewing “by sight,” especially her children’s struggles and her own doubts about herself, she felt God prompting her to see them “by faith” instead.

Ruth thought about how often she had reminded her children that she loved them and that God loved them. She thought about how she brought them to Mass every week, where they received Jesus’ Body and Blood in Communion. She thought about how she

had taught them to apologize and offer forgiveness to one another, and how they did it, even if it was begrudging at times!

Ruth also reflected on the passages from God’s word that had meant so much to her, verses like Isaiah 54:13: “All your children shall be taught by the Lord; great shall be the peace of your children.” And Matthew 13:31-32, where Jesus describes how the smallest seed can produce the largest of plants. Closing her Bible, Ruth’s heart felt lighter and her mind felt clearer.

Think about a burden you are carrying today. Now, ponder today’s words from St. Paul: “We walk by faith, not by sight.” How is the Lord inviting you to view that situation by faith? Perhaps you could search out or recall Scripture passages that give you a renewed perspective. God has given you the gift of faith, and he is so pleased when you use it!

Saint

Of the Week

St. Romuald

Abbot and Founder

Feast Day: June 19

Born to Italian nobility, Romuald enjoyed all the pleasures of his family's wealth and position during his early years. His life shifted dramatically, however, after he watched his father kill a relative in a duel over property. Overcome with shame by his father's actions, Romuald withdrew to the monastery of St. Apollinare to serve penance for his father's sin as if it were his own.

There, Romuald embraced the monastic life and sought an even more austere existence than the one practiced by the Benedictine monks. After several years of devoted study and prayer, he was made an abbot. But when he attempted to impose his stricter discipline on the monks, they strongly resisted his reforms, and Romuald left to wander the mountains in solitude.

After establishing several small hermitages, he embarked on a mission to evangelize the pagans of Hungary, but his journey was interrupted by sickness. Convinced his illness was a sign that God wanted him to remain in Italy, Romuald returned to his homeland. He traveled extensively through the country's central and northern regions, establishing hermitages and attracting disciples along the way.

Salvation in Solitude

In 1016, Romuald founded a monastery at Camaldoli. Using the Benedictine Rule as his guide, he developed a stricter, more austere Rule for his new Order. Mostly, the monks remained secluded in individual cells, each containing its own chapel. After several years, Romuald again felt God's call to move. He built more hermitages in the mountains before retiring to his cell at a monastery he had founded in the valley of Castro.



BRIEF RULE OF SAINT ROMUALD

WRITTEN CIRCA AD 1006

Sit in your cell as in paradise. Put the whole world behind you and forget it. Watch your thoughts like a good fisherman watching for fish. The path you must follow is in the Psalms — never leave it.

If you have just come to the monastery, and in spite of your good will you cannot accomplish what you want, take every opportunity you can to sing the Psalms in your heart and to understand them with your mind.

And if your mind wanders as you read, do not give up; hurry back and apply your mind to the words once more.

Realize above all that you are in God's presence, and stand there with the attitude of one who stands before the emperor.

Empty yourself completely and sit waiting, content with the grace of God, like the chick who tastes nothing and eats nothing but what his mother brings him.
