"Who then is this whom even wind and sea obey?"

I t wasn't an unreasonable question for the disciples to ask. They had been with Jesus and seen him perform healings, teach crowds of people, even dispute with religious leaders. But they had *never* seen anything like this! Sure, as fishermen they knew how to survive violent squalls on the Sea of Galilee. But never had anyone done it by calming the wind and the waves with a command!

The disciples' question is a good one for you to ask as well. Scriptural answers can help you not only recognize but also proclaim the power of goodness of the Lord.

Who is this? He is the Word of God, who was at the Father's side from the beginning, the One through whom all things came to be (John 1:2-3). He was an active participant when the Father created everything. He is just as involved in your life.

Who is this? He is the same God as the One who "shut within doors of the sea" and "set limits for it" (Job 38: 8, 10). Since he



created all things, he has authority over those created things. Nothing is beyond his control, not even the greatest challenge you may be facing today.

Who is this? He is the One who, today's responsorial psalm tells us, "hushed the storm to a gentle breeze" (107:29). He can bring peace to the turmoil in nature, and he can do the same for the turmoil in your own heart.

Who is this? He is the One whose word goes forth and accomplishes his purposes and plans in this world (Isaiah 55:11). He spoke, and all things came into being. His word has the same power in your life, the power to bring the healing, forgiveness, and peace that he proclaims.

Who is this? This is Jesus, eternal Son of the Father, who creates and sustains all things (Colossians 1:16-17). He holds all of creation together. And he holds you and your loved ones as well.

Letter from Fr. Jacob-Matthew Smith, OFM

This weekend marks my last weekend as the Pastor of St. Clare Catholic Church. 





June 28: Civility


Pray that God would give us the grace to remember the dignity of all and invite others to do the same.









St. Josemaría Escrivá de Balaguer y Albas

Founder of Opus Dei


Feast Day: June 26

e was born on January 9, 1902 in Barbastro, in the Pyrenees. As a teenager he already felt a calling to the priesthood. Josemaría went to a seminary in 1918 and specialized in canonic law. He was ordained on March 28, 1925. He worked as a priest in the country side and in 1927 moved to Madrid to continue his canonic law studies. He was also involved in charity work in the poorest districts of the city. These activities led him to create, in 1928, the first structures of Opus Dei, an association of laypersons who are involved in activities expressing love of neighbor. The community developed, and a female branch was created in 1930, followed by a priest's branch in 1943.

he period of civil war that broke out in 1936 was not easy for Opus Dei and its founder. This innovative trend in Christian life was disliked by both republicans and the supporters of the extremely rightist dictatorship of Franco.

International character of Opus Dei

Fr. Josemaría moved to France and only returned to Spain in 1940. His activities were criticized and he faced suspicion and accusations. Opus Dei started to gain international recognition. In order to take better care of its development, Fr. Escrivá moved to Romein 1946. There, at the Pontifical Lateran University, he obtained a doctoral degree in canonic law. He served with his legal knowledge at different institution in the Holy See. In 1950 he obtained papal approval for Opus Dei, which had become a very popular religious movement by that time.



r. Josemaría died on June 26, 1975 in Rome. He was canonized on October 6, 2002.
