“We look not to what is seen but to what is unseen.”



St. Paul must have been a marvel! Not only was he a passionate apostle and evangelist, but he was also a skilled theologian and writer. He founded some of the most important churches in the ancient world. More than one-quarter of the New Testament was either written by him, written about him, or attributed to him. What's more, Paul accomplished all of this while enduring ongoing persecution and suffering!

What kept Paul? Today's second reading gives us the answer: his heart was filled with a heavenly vision. Paul could consider beatings and ship wrecks as "light affliction" because he had received glimpses of the "eternal weight of glory" that awaited him (2 Corinthians 4:17). He could make light of how his "outer self" was "wasting away" because the Lord kept renewing his "inner self" (4:16). And he was able to keep his focus off the hardships staring him in the face because he kept seeking insight into

"what is unseen," the eternal truths of a loving, faithful God (4:18).

All of this may sound hopelessly out of reach, but the truth is, the kind of heavenly vision St. Paul describes is open to everyone. That's because it doesn't depend on our talents but on the Spirit's grace. All he asks of us is faithfulness to prayer, an open and humble heart, and a promise to be patient as he slowly opens our eyes.

God *wants* to give you a heavenly vision! Even in the midst of any "light afflictions" you may be experiencing, he can give you his consolation and strength. Even when you can't seem to see the way ahead, he will bring the path to heaven into sharper focus. So keep fixing your heart on "what is unseen." Keep asking the Spirit to help you look at "what is seen" with new eyes (2 Corinthians 4:18). This is one prayer he loves to answer!

First Ten Days of National Eucharistic Pilgrimage Yield Transformative Stories and Encounters

(OSV News) - A chance meeting during a May 28 Eucharistic procession in the streets of Victoria, Texas, led to a profound spiritual encounter for one young man and perpetual pilgrim Charlie McCullough. This event is one among many that have marked the first ten days of the National Eucharistic Pilgrimage headed towards Indianapolis for a significant Congress.

The young man, unfamiliar with the concept of a Eucharistic procession, was intrigued by the sight and after learning that the procession was carrying Jesus in the Eucharist, he felt drawn to follow and learn more. This search for meaning spiraled into a deeper conversation about faith and purpose and a newfound desire to align his life's journey with that of the Lord.

The deeply moving story shared by McCullough is emblematic of the transformative power of the pilgrimage, which began from various geographical starting points on May 18—19 and spans across four separate routes.

Pilgrims have recorded numerous encounters that illustrate the profound impact of the pilgrimage. These include instances of spontaneous prayer, intense curiosity about the Eucharist, and even spontaneous decisions to pursue Catholicism, such as the case with a secular photographer who, captivated by the devotion of the masses, decided to explore the faith further.

In addition to sharing personal moments of faith, the pilgrims have engaged people in both urban centers and remote areas, bringing the sacred presence of Jesus in the Eucharist to thousands, including those confined to nursing homes or otherwise unable to participate in public events.

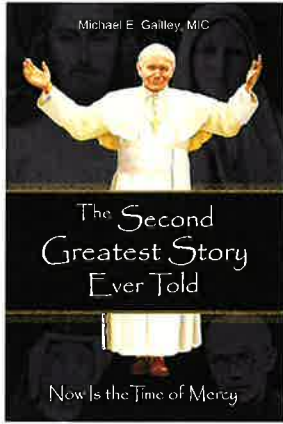
The pilgrims have noted both the intensity and the beauty of their packed itineraries, remarking on the providential moments that reignite their commitment to this spiritual endeavor. The presence of dedicated clergy and the myriad of encounters with the faithful serve as a powerful

testament to the mission and potential of the pilgrimage.

The pilgrimage has already brought change, joy, and renewal, with participants carrying with them the prayer intentions of many. Looking forward, the pilgrims continue their journey, connecting people across the nation with the divine in an unprecedented display of communal faith.

FAQs About the National Eucharistic Pilgrimage

- 1. What is the National Eucharistic Pilgrimage?** The NEP is a spiritual journey undertaken by a group of perpetual pilgrims. It involves processions and events celebrating the Eucharist across various routes in the United States, culminating at the National Eucharistic Congress in Indianapolis.
- 2. Why was the National Eucharistic Pilgrimage organized?** To renew faith in the Real Presence of Jesus in the Eucharist and to unite the faithful in prayer and worship across the country.
- 3. How can I submit a prayer request to the perpetual pilgrims?** Prayer requests can be submitted online at the dedicated prayer request page found at <https://tinyurl.com/NEP-prayers>.
- 4. Are there specific events associated with the pilgrimage?** Yes, the pilgrimage features a series of Eucharistic processions, Holy Hours, Masses, and visits to sacred sites and parishes along the routes. Notable events include blessings from high-ranking church officials and large-scale community gatherings.
- 5. Can anyone join the pilgrimage?** While the group of perennial pilgrims remains constant, the public is encouraged to join the pilgrimage during its community events, processions, and public Masses as it makes its way through their region.

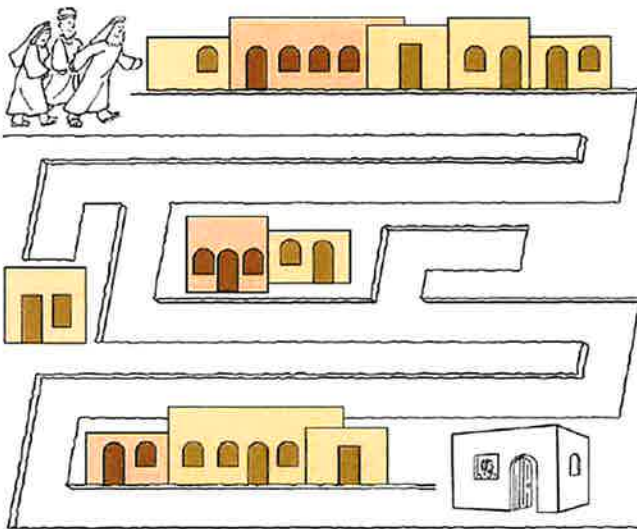

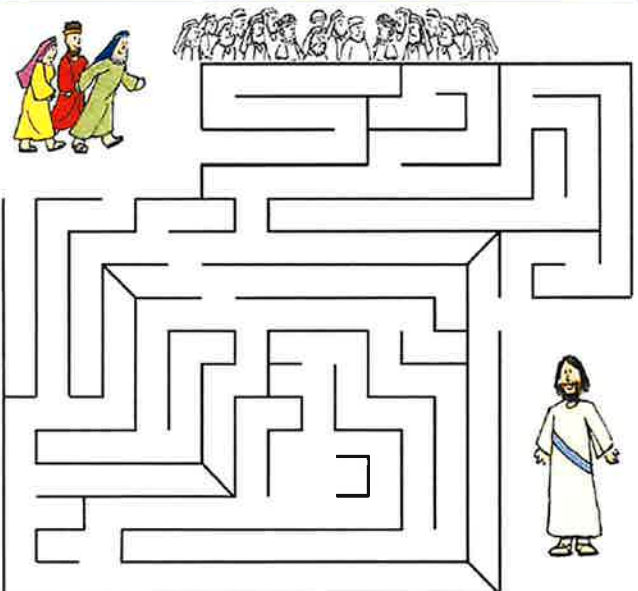

Catholics Participating in National Eucharistic Pilgrimage and the National Eucharistic Congress Have Opportunities to Receive Plenary Indulgences.

“It is with gratitude to the Holy Father that we receive his Apostolic Blessing upon the participants in the National Eucharistic Congress, and for the opportunity for Catholics in our country to obtain a plenary indulgence by participating in the events of the Eucharistic Revival,” said Archbishop Timothy P. Brogilio, president of the U.S. Conference of Catholic Bishops. Fostering encounter, sparking personal conversion, and forming disciples will be opportunities for a personal revival in the faith and the fruits of the National Eucharistic Pilgrimage and National Eucharistic Congress to be held this summer.

Plenary Indulgence for National Eucharistic Pilgrimage

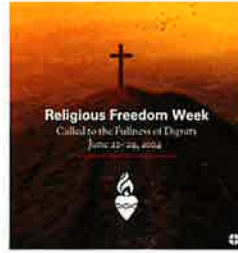
A decree issued by the Apostolic Penitentiary and approved by Pope Francis indicates that the plenary indulgence will be granted to the Christian faithful who participate in the National Eucharistic Pilgrimage at any point between May 17 and July 16, 2024. It will also be granted to the elderly, infirm, and all those who cannot leave their homes for a serious reason and who participate in spirit with the National Eucharistic Pilgrimage, uniting their prayers, pains, or inconveniences with Christ and the pilgrimage. This indulgence is granted under the usual conditions of sacramental Confession, Eucharistic Communion, and prayer for the intentions of the Holy Father. The faithful may also apply this indulgence through suffrage for the souls of the faithful departed in Purgatory. In recognition of this extraordinary event, the Apostolic Penitentiary also requests that all priests who have been endowed with the appropriate faculties for hearing Confessions present themselves willingly and generously in administering the Sacrament of Penance to all who participate in the National Eucharistic Pilgrimage.

Papal Blessing with Plenary Indulgence for National Eucharistic Congress

The second decree issued by the Apostolic Penitentiary and approved by Pope Francis, says that Archbishop Brogilio or another prelate of episcopal rank assigned by him, following the Holy Sacrifice of the Mass, may impart the Papal Blessing with a Plenary Indulgence to the Christian Faithful who participate in the National Eucharistic Congress, who are truly repentant, and who are motivated by charity, if the usual conditions for indulgences—sacramental Confession, Eucharistic Communion, and prayer for the intentions of the Holy Father—have been met. Faithful individuals who, due to reasonable circumstances and with pious intention, have participated in the sacred rites and received the Papal Blessing through media communications, may also obtain a Plenary Indulgence.





Of the Week

St. Methodius of Constantinople

Patriarch

Feast Day: June 14

Born near the end of the eighth century, Methodius came from a wealthy family. As a young man, he traveled to Constantinople, seeking a position at the court of the Byzantine emperor. However, Methodius met a monk who convinced him to pursue a religious vocation instead.

Methodius thrived in his new career, and later, he founded a monastery on the Greek island of Khios. Then in 815, Emperor Leo V prohibited the veneration of religious images.

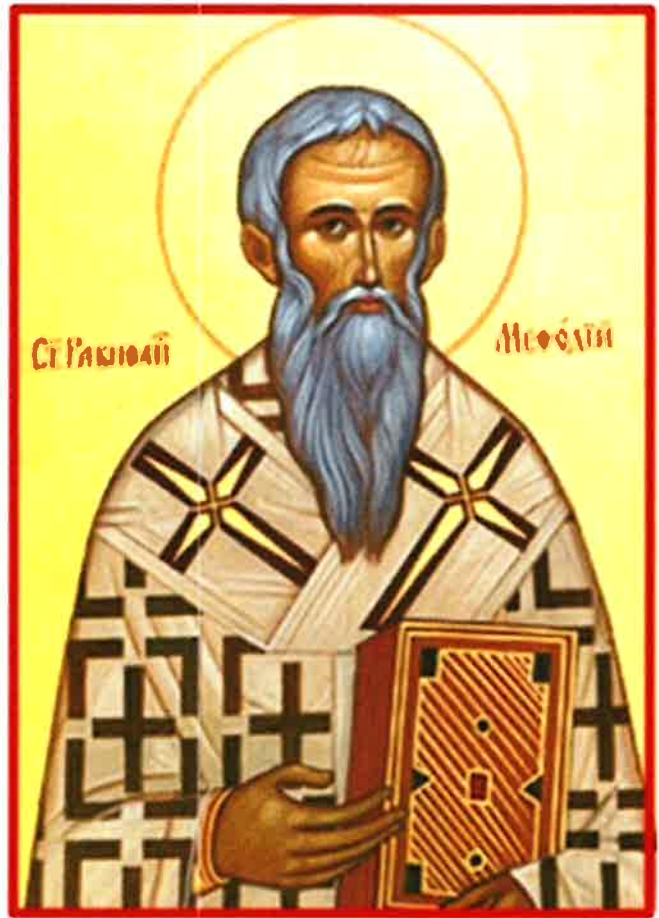
This edict supported a group called Iconoclasts, members of the Eastern church who wanted to destroy icons altogether, so they could not be revered. So Methodius was called back to Constantinople by the city's patriarch, Nicephorus, to help in the battle against the Iconoclasts.

For opposing Leo, Nicephorus was exiled and Methodius was also forced to flee. He went to Rome, then returned to Constantinople in 821, after Leo's death. Methodius encouraged the new emperor, Michael, to end the Iconoclastic movement. Instead, the emperor had Methodius imprisoned.

From Prisoner to Patriarch

Methodius spent seven years in a tiny cell that he shared with two thieves. When he was finally released, he was painfully frail but still dedicated to fighting for his cause. Eventually, when Empress Theodora came into power, the Iconoclastic movement ended and Methodius was appointed patriarch.

He immediately approved the use of icons and held a Festival of Orthodoxy to celebrate the occasion, which continues annually to this day. Methodius died in 847, having fulfilled his goal of restoring art to the Church.



Dear God,

Your spirit touches us, Your faithful servants, in many ways. Methodius knew that works of art come from Your divine inspiration. They nurture the soul as much as they please the eye and calm the heart. Help me to see Your hand in all the art I find in the world, whether it be paint on a canvas or the orange glow of light from the sky at sunset. Everything of beauty comes from You.
