the Twelve and

How do you think the apostles reacted when Jesus told them he was sending them out to preach, heal the sick, and drive out demons? Maybe they had a moment of panic, or at least some trepidation. They probably wondered if they could do what he was asking!

No matter how they felt, the Twelve were able to go out and minister to the surrounding towns because they believed in Jesus. If he was calling them to this work, then they trusted that he would help them to accomplish it.

That’s the kind of faith we all need when God calls us to do something we feel unqualified or unworthy to carry out:

- *Faith that Jesus is truly calling us and “sending us out” in some way.* That kind of faith requires you to trust that he has some kind of mission just for you and that through prayer or in Adoration, you will hear what he has in mind.

- *Faith that the Lord will equip us to do this work.* You may see only what you lack, but the Lord sees all your gifts, some of which you might not even be aware of. He has confidence in your abilities, and he might even send you new gifts—as well as other believers—to help you.
- *Faith that our efforts will bear fruit.* You might not see such fruit immediately, and perhaps you will never see it in your lifetime. But you can trust that the Lord had a purpose for you in mind and that if you are faithful to him, he will be faithful to you.

Where is God sending you today? It might not require you to “go” very far—it could very well be to your parish, neighborhood, or workplace. And unlike the apostles, you can bring more than a walking stick with you! What you do need is a heaping amount of faith—and the Lord will give it to you if you ask for it!

St. Alexis of Rome

Patron of Beggars and Pilgrims

Feast Day: July 17



Alexis, also known as Alexis or Alessio, was the only son of noble Roman parents. Early on, Alexis possessed a great religious fervor. He was betrothed to an heiress and

wed her in a grand ceremony. But before the marriage was consummated on their wedding night, Alexis's wife agreed to release him, and he secretly left his father's house and walked to Syria.

He settled there and lived as a beggar in a shack next to the church of Our Lady of Edessa for the next 17 years. The faithful Christian accepted only as much charity as he needed to live. Eventually, the servants of Alexis's parents came to Syria looking for him. To Alexis's surprise and joy, they did not recognize him. They thought he was a beggar and gave him alms.

Man of God

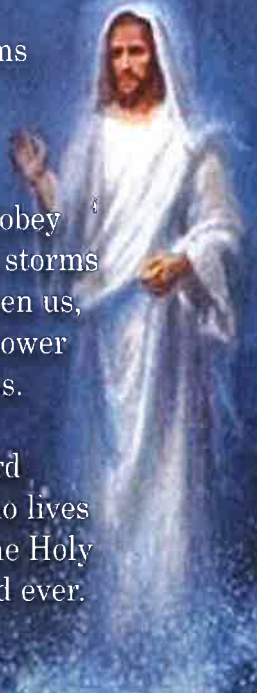
Alexis became well known when an image of the Blessed Virgin miraculously spoke and called him a man of God. No longer living in obscurity, Alexis boarded a ship leaving for St. Paul's home of Tarsus. But winds carried the ship to Italy, so he returned to Rome. Alexis asked for lodging and was given permission to sleep under the staircase. He stayed there another 17 years, praying and teaching children their catechism.

When Alexis knew that he was dying, he wrote a letter telling the story of his life. In 404, a voice was heard by everyone at the Pope's Mass, saying, "Seek the man of God, he will pray for Rome, and the Lord will be favorable to it; he will die Friday." That week, Alexis was found lifeless under the stairs with the letter in his hand.

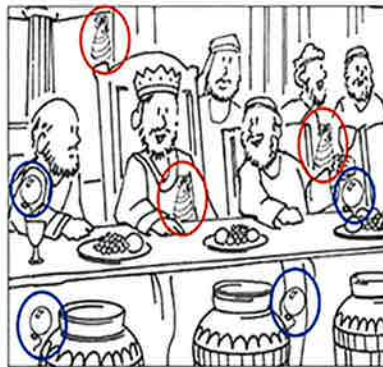

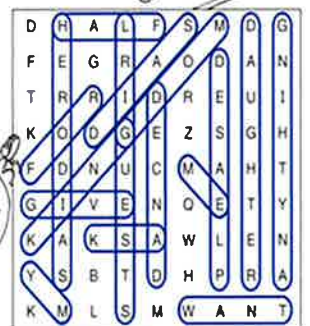
