"If anyone wishes to be first, he shall be the last of all and the servant of all."



The first shall be last? This is one of those sayings of Jesus that goes against our natural desires. We don't want to be the last one in line, and we certainly don't want to be the servant! So how can we become the humble servants that the Lord is calling us to be?

Jesus provides an answer at the end of today's Gospel passage: "Whoever receives one child such as this in my name, receives me; and who receives me, receives not me but the One who sent me" (Mark 9:37). Jesus is telling us that he is inseparable from his people. He loves us so deeply that he died for us and came to live in our hearts.

So what we do for others, we are doing for Christ. This truth should revolutionize the way we interact with he people around us. Think about it: if Jesus walked through our front door today, we would immediately get busy addressing his needs. "Come in, Jesus; sit

down, Jesus. You look hungry; I'll make you anything you want to eat. "We would be so quick to serve him that we just might overwhelm him with our kindness! But when we see a brother or sister in need, we often, either explicitly or implicitly, weigh our options: Does this fit in my schedule? How much will this cost me? What will I get out of this in return?

God is calling us out of any selfish regard for ourselves and into a selfless love for others. Today, ask for the eyes to see other people the way God the Father sees them: as another Christ. This will paint everyday situations in a new light. Christ is the lonely parishioner who is looking for a friend; he is the sick neighbor who needs a meal. When you are serving such people, you are serving the Lord himself!



Dominican Sister of Peace Mary Ruth Angelette, OP

Dominican Sister of Peace Mary Ruth Angelette, OP. (87), a native of New Orleans, LA, died on September 9, 2024, in Metairie, LA.

The youngest of five, Sr. Ruth was born to Ruth Rear and Joseph Angelette. A graduate of St. Mary's Dominican High School, Ruth entered the community in 1955, made her first profession in 1957, and took her final vows in 1960. She would have celebrated her 65th Jubilee in 2025.

Sr. Ruth earned a Bachelor of Science in Education from St. Mary's Dominican College and her master's in education from Marquette University

She taught in elementary schools for five years before becoming the founding Principal at Saint Clare School in

Waveland. She ministered there for eight years and helped to rebuild after the school's destruction by Hurricane Camille. For more than forty years, she ministered as a teacher, principal, Vice President of Mission and Vision, and Director of the Montessori Preschool, among other roles at Saint Anthony of Padua School in Bunkie, Louisiana,

Sister Ruth's contributions were widely recognized within the Congregation. She served eight years as a Councilor and Personnel Director, followed by four years as Assistant to the Major Superior.

In her letter to the Congregation, Sr. Pat Twohill recalled that when Sister Ruth requested Final Profession, she wrote, "I love my vocation and my community and will continue to pray for the grace to remain faithful to both." Her unwavering commitment and faithfulness were clear to everyone who knew her and those she served.

Sister Ruth is survived by beloved family members, especially her niece, Geral Farmer, and her devoted friends, Nell Mechana and Sr. Michaeline Green.







Martyrs and Patrons of Doctors and Pharmacists

According to legend, Cosmas and Damian were twin brothers possibly born in Arabia, during the third century. After studying the sciences in Syria and becoming physicians, they went to live at the seaport of Λ egeae in Cilicia, where they took up the practice of medicine. Their skill as healers brought them widespread fame, and patients soon thronged to them for help.

In addition to their medical expertise, Cosmas and Damian had a talent for spiritual healing. As Christians, the brothers were dedicated to God, and their example inspired many patients to convert. Admired for their charity as well, they frequently refused to accept payment for their services. Unfortunately, both their openness and prominence made them easy targets for enemies of Christians.

Victims of Persecution

Cosmas and Damian were among those arrested during the renewed persecution of Christians under the emperor Diocletian. They were brought before Lysias, the governor of Cilicia, and ordered to recant their faith. When the brothers refused, they were subjected to a variety of tortures. But nothing seemed to harm them. In the end, they were beheaded, as were their three brothers.


Their fame spread throughout the Christian world. A church erected in their honor in Constantinople during the fifth century became a prominent place of pilgrimage. Sick people would spend the night sleeping in the church, hoping to be cured by Cosmas and Damian in their dreams.
