hat a bold demand! James and John seem to have forgotten what Jesus had taught them about greatness. He had just rebuked them: "Whoever does not accept the kingdom of God like a child will not enter it" (Mark 10:15). Jesus' model of greatness confounded them because in his kingdom, "[the] last will be first" (10:31).

James and John should have known that Jesus valued humility, not prominence. They should have remembered, "If anyone wishes to be first, he shall be the last of all and the servant of all" (Mark 9:35). But all they could think about was their position in his kingdom. They wanted to be great, to be important, to be right up front with Jesus. But he insisted that "the Son of Man did not come to be served but to serve and to give his life as a ransom for many" (10:45).

Jesus's model of greatness challenges our expectations, too. We all want to be great in some way. We might want to be admired at work or seen as a good parent. We might even want to do great

things for God: to live a holy life, to make a difference in the world, or to raise a family that loves Jesus and serves the Church. These are all good desires. Even James and John's willingness to drink the cup with Jesus was a good one. Their desires just needed to be purified—and so do ours. Rather than demanding that God bend to our will and do for us whatever we ask, we need to yield to his will.

Like James and John, we need a servant's heart. We need the kind of heart that Jesus showed when he taught and healed and fed the hungry, when he washed his disciples' feet, and when he offered his body and blood. We need to imitate Jesus when he didn't make demands but yielded to his Father, saying, "Not my will but yours be done" (Luke 22:42). May we all embrace the heart of our Savior!





Dr. Bill Bradford honored....





St. Mary Bertilla Boscardin

Sister of the Sisters of St. Dorothy Feast Day October 20

Born into rural poverty, Anna Francesca Boscardin was the daughter of an alcoholic, abusive father. Anna had little schooling and many people in her village thought she was stupid and useless child.

But her priest knew better, and he found a safe haven for her. A few years later, she begged to be admitted to the Convent of the Sisters of St. Dorothy, humbly saying, "I can't do anything. I'm a poor thing, a goose. Teach me. I want to become a saint." She was admitted and took the name of Mary Bertilla. From then on, the teen who had been described as "ailing in health, of slight intellectual capacity, and lacking in initiative," dedicated her life to others. Mary Bertilla indeed became a devoted, tireless and

compassionate servant of God.

Selfless Humanitarian


Her first years in the convent were spent in the kitchen and laundry. Then, in 1907, Mary Bertilla found her true calling—caring for the critically ill in the children's ward at a local hospital.


During World War I, as Mary Bertilla braved bombs and shells to care for wounded soldiers and air-raid victims in hospitals at the front, she attracted the attention of her superiors. Unfortunately, they thought she was becoming too attached to her patients, and they sent her back to laundry duty. But her kindness, courage and perseverance had reached the Mother-General of the Order, and when the war ended, Mary Bertilla was placed in charge of the children's isolation ward at Treviso hospital, where she had begun her nursing.

Then her health began to fail once again. Diagnosed with advanced cancer, Mary Bertilla endured an unsuccessful operation and died on October 20, 1922. She was beatified 30 years later and canonized in 1961, with some of her former patients in attendance.

O Virgin, Star of the Sea, Our beloved Mother, we ask you to intercede on our behalf to your Son, Jesus, to protect all who are in danger of hurricanes and other destructive weather. May His calming powers keep us safe and alert through this Hurricane season. Let us pray to the Lord.
