"She, from her poverty, has contributed all she had."



hat a contrast! The scribes in today's Gospel were conscious of how they appeared to others. Their long robes matched up nicely with their long prayers, and who wouldn't agree that time spent in the synagogues was time well spent? Compared to these men, the widow seemed insignificant. Anyone looking at her could probably tell that she was poor. Her clothes were probably torn, and her shoes were worn thin. It could be easy to see her two small coins as a reflection of her own limited value.

But looks can be deceiving. "The Lord looks into the heart" (1 Samuel 16:7), and this widow's heart was given over to the Lord. By being willing to give "all she had, her whole livelihood," she was also offering the Lord her energy, her time, and her prayers (Mark 12:44). The scribes should have been willing to do the same. But Jesus knew that their hearts were full of themselves. They clung too tightly to their pride and their position as scholars of the Law and expected everyone to treat them with great honor and respect.

Let's use this Gospel passage today to examine our own hearts. Are we willing to offer "all we have" to the Lord? Or do we hold onto some things—or some people—too tightly? Maybe we cling to our status and the respect that comes with it. Maybe we are holding onto our money too tightly instead of giving generously to those in need. Maybe we have too tight a grasp on our free time instead of being willing to serve someone. We might even struggle with "letting go" of someone close to us, like our adult children.

If you detect that you are holding onto something or someone too tightly, don't despair! Imagine the Lord standing before you, smiling as he receives whatever gift you offer him. Then hear him say, "Don't worry. I can give you all that you need!"

Saint

Of the Week



St. Martin of Tours Patron of Soldiers, Beggars and Tailors Feast Day: November 11

Born around 336, Matin was the son of a Roman Soldier who eventually became a high-raking military officer. Growing up in Italy, Martin, who was a peace-loving lad and attracted to Christianity, was required to enter the army at the age of 15. Martin's parents were pagans, and his father was particularly opposed to Christianity. So against his father's wishes, Martin prepared to become a Christian, living as simply as he could and giving most of what he had to the poor.

Even though Soldiers of his rank often had several servants, Martin insisted on having only one and treated the man as an equal. Martin shared

his meals with him and regarded him as a friend, which was highly irregular in a time when society was very strictly divided by class and rank.


Commitment to Christ

One bitterly cold day, as Martin's unit marched through Amiens in Gaul, he spotted a half-dressed beggar, shivering near the city's gate. Martin had already given away what he had, but when everyone else ignored the man, Martin took off his cloak, split it in half with his sword and gave half of it to him. The next night, Martin dreamed of Jesus, dressed in the half cloak, and heard Him proclaim that Martin had clothed Him in it. Martin's commitment to Christ deepened even more, and he was immediately baptized.

Upon his discharge, Martin lived as a hermit. As word of his holiness spread, he attracted many followers, eventually founding the first monastery in Gaul. Martin then became Bishop of Tours, and for the next 25 years, he missioned throughout Gaul, especially to those who lived in isolated areas. Martin died in 397, and to this day, he is known as Martin the merciful.

O Virgin, Star of the Sea, Our beloved Mother, we ask you to intercede on our behalf to your Son, Jesus, to protect all who are in danger of hurricanes and other destructive weather. May His calming powers keep us safe and alert through this Hurricane season. Let us pray to the Lord.

FATHER RYAN STAWAISZ

HEROIC SERVICE IN HIS FINAL DAYS

Chortly before his ordination, Ryan Stawaisz received a devastating Ocancer diagnosis—his second one after successfully beating cancer as a junior in college.

Despite his diagnosis, Fr. Ryan began his priestly ministry at Prince of Peace in Houston in 2019. Just two years later, on June 21, 2021, the young priest passed away, leaving a lasting impact on his parishioners, many of whom attested to his tremendous witness.

Those who knew Fr. Ryan were deeply touched by his selfless ministry, even in his final days as a priest-so much so that he has inspired a film about his life.

His brother Ross Stawaisz says he hopes Fr. Ryan's story will show the "need to stand up for some things. You need to live your life in a way that emulates Christ."

Fr. Ryan's mother, Susan Stawaisz, said she has heard from several cancer patients on how the movie has touched them: "I feel like anybody who's gone through any kind of suffering can relate to offering up your suffering and suffering heroically."

RECENTLY ORDAINED PRIESTS


ORIGINS of PRIESTHOOD

Pope Francis has emphasized that seminarians must be "men of communion" who arise organically from the communities they serve, then return after seminary to minister even more profoundly.

That vision is slowly becoming a reality in the U.S., with most of the priests ordained in 2024 reporting active involvement in their parishes and schools.

According to CARA's recent study of men ordained in 2024, the average age at which they first considered the priesthood was 16. Between 32% and 42% went to a Catholic elementary school, high school, or college. About 60% obtained college degrees before seminary, and 70% had full-time work experience. A full 75% reported regularly participating in Eucharistic Adoration before entering priestly formation.






SMALL GROUPS

DEEP DISCERNMENT

The Melchizedek Project, a longstanding program that starts priesthood discernment groups for young men, was re-launched this summer with a new format. "I dream of a day when young men enter seminary, not *looking* for a father, but having been *brought* by their fathers," said Deacon James Keating of Omaha, who is renowned for his work in priestly formation.
