Higher-end cameras have a setting called “portrait mode,” which focuses only on the face of the individual you are trying to capture while blurring out everything in the background. In today’s gospel, Jesus congratulates a scribe who has come to see God in this way. The scribe understands that *loving* God and his people is the most important thing he can do. Everything else is background—not erased, of course, but secondary when compared to the main picture!

You can probably recall times when you have lost your focus on the Lord. Maybe your gaze was fixed on a new car or some other pricey object you wanted to buy. Perhaps duties and deadlines pulled your vision away. Or maybe there have been times when you approached your spiritual life as routine and focused on secondary tasks and needs instead. This doesn’t usually happen all at once, and sometimes we aren’t even aware that it has happened until some challenge wakes us up to our predicament.

So how can we keep our focus on the Lord as this scribe did? How can we make sure that we are placing a priority on loving him? We can remember to dedicate even the ordinary parts of our days to the Lord. We can make a morning offering to him every day when we wake up and try lifting up some spontaneous prayers at different times during the day. We can invite the Lord into a stressful meeting, look for him in our fellow commuters, or pause to acknowledge the Holy Spirit at the kitchen sink.

Loving God with all our hearts doesn’t have to be an intense, all-day prayer marathon. Sometimes all it takes is a glance toward heaven to refocus our hearts on him. The more you do this, the more you’ll find your preoccupations and worries fading into the background—and Jesus, your loving Savior, filling your heart and your vision!

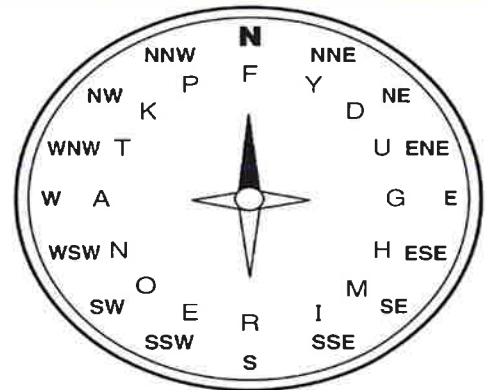

What is the "Church Suffering?"

In purgatory, our brothers and sisters in Christ prepare to be wholly united with God and His saints.

Right now in heaven, there is a banquet filled with souls who have reached the beatific vision. These saints are those members of the Body of Christ who have been made perfect and now enjoy complete communion with God. We call this part of the Communion of Saints the *Church Triumphant*, since they have joined Christ in His triumph over sin and death.

Those of us living, who have not yet conquered death and still suffer temptation and decay, are not in complete communion with God and the saints. However, God in His goodness still invites us into the Body of Christ on earth through the Holy Catholic Church. As members of His earthly Church, we must still suffer death and decay, undergo temptation, and fight the spiritual battle for our souls. This is why the Holy Catholic Church on earth is called the *Church Militant*.

There are other souls, those who have left earth but are not yet in a state of total communion with God. These souls are members of the *Church Suffering* in purgatory. As the Catechism states:—*Catechism of the Catholic Church*, 1030

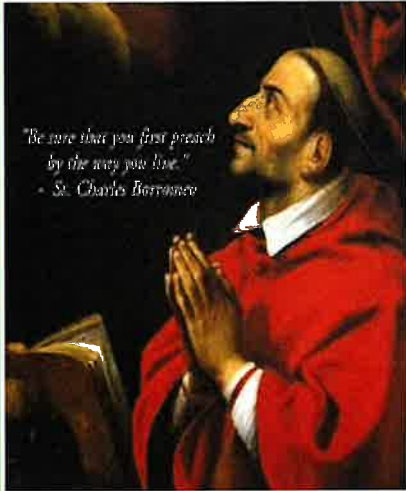
All who die in God's grace and friendship, but still imperfectly purified, are indeed assured of their eternal salvation; but after death they undergo purification, so as to achieve the holiness necessary to enter the joy of heaven.

The Church gives the name *purgatory* to this final purification of the elect. Because these holy souls in purgatory are separated from God, they feel a deep pain of longing for Him. However, this pain is bearable because it is through it that holy souls will enter into the banquet of heaven. As purgatory is the necessary reality for certain souls to enter heaven, it is still a holy place and is referred to as being adjacent to heaven. Since the souls in purgatory will one day be united to God and the Church Triumphant, they are still members of the Holy Church. Hence, these holy souls are referred to as the Church Suffering.

During November, we honor the Church Suffering and dedicate the month to their honor. It's a particularly fruitful and appropriate time to offer all we can as remedies for these precious souls. As we understand the very real possibility of one day experiencing purgatory ourselves, let us be greatly attentive to the needs of the holy souls in purgatory and cultivate a devotion to them.

Of the Week



St. Charles Borromeo

Patron of Catechumens, Bishops, Catechists and stomach ailments

Feast Day: November 4

On October 2, 1538, Charles Borromeo was born to a noble family in the castle at Arona on Lake Maggiore in northern Italy. Charles received his basic education from the Benedictines and went on to earn a doctorate in civil and canon law in 1559. That same year, his uncle became Pope Pius IV.

The new Pope made 22-year-old Charles a cardinal, although he was not yet a priest, as well as administrator of the archdiocese of Milan. However, before Charles could go to Milan, he was also given several other Church positions, including one that made him, in effect, the Pope's secretary of state. Because of his numerous responsibilities, Charles was forced to let auxiliaries run the Milan

archdiocese, which covered much of Italy and most of Switzerland.

The Council of Trent

Charles was the force behind the Council of Trent's final session in 1562, and he personally drafted the council's catechism. Finally, in 1563, he was ordained a priest and bishop.

After Pope Pius IV died in 1566, Charles went to Milan to initiate the Council of Trent's reforms in his archdiocese, where he founded seminaries that became models for others. He also set up a confraternity of Christian Doctrine through which thousands of catechists taught children in Sunday schools.

The Council of Trent

Charles traveled throughout his archdiocese, teaching and preaching – despite a speech impediment. In tumultuous times riddled with the devastating effects of famine and plague, he saw to it that the people were fed and cared for at whatever cost, ignoring the mounting serious debts. But Charles wore himself out with work and died in 1584 at the age of 46.

O Virgin, Star of the Sea, Our beloved Mother, we ask you to intercede on our behalf to your Son, Jesus, to protect all who are in danger of hurricanes and other destructive weather. May His calming powers keep us safe and alert through this Hurricane season. Let us pray to the Lord.

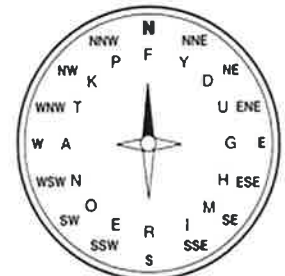
