If you could sum up Jesus' mission in just a few words, you might say that he came to *set us free*. That's what he told the townspeople in the Nazareth synagogue as he read from the prophet's scroll: he had been sent "to proclaim liberty to captives" and "to let the oppressed go free" (Luke 4:18; see Isaiah 61:1).

The people listening to Jesus that day might have thought back to the time when their ancestors were released from Babylonian captivity, or perhaps they envisioned one day being freed from Roman oppression. But Jesus had something much greater in mind. He came to set us free from sin and death itself, and from everything that prevents us from living the abundant life he came to give us.

So what would you like to be set from right now? Perhaps worry has you tied up in knots, casting a shadow over everything you say or do. Maybe it's fear that keeps you awake at night or stops you from taking that next step in following

the Lord. You could be feeling discouraged about the state of the world or the state of your family. Or perhaps you're fighting a compulsion that leads you into sin.

We often accept these things as an inevitable part of living as fallen people in a fallen world. But that kind of thinking discounts the power of Jesus' cross and resurrection. He died and rose so that you could be set free from anything that steals your peace and joy!

Today take some time to examine your heart. Is there anything holding you captive? If so, let it go by offering it up to the Lord. Then make an act of faith by telling Jesus that you believe his proclamation to the people of Nazareth. Through his death and resurrection, he really has let the oppressed go free—and that includes every one of us!

Saint

Of the Week

St. Marcella

"Glory of the Ladies of Rome"

Feast Day: January 31

As a child, Marcella loved to hear stories about the ascetic monks of Egypt. The daughter of Roman nobility, she married to please her mother, but her husband died shortly after the wedding. When the Roman consul Cerealis proposed to Marcella, she refused, choosing instead the austere life of Eastern monks.

Marcella began to perform charitable works and turned her home on the Aventine Hill into a school where noble women could study the Scriptures. She avoided wine and meat and spent her time in prayer, reading and visiting the shrines of martyrs. When the desert monk Jerome arrived in Rome, he agreed to become her community's spiritual leader. For three years, Jerome guided them in prayer, charity and studying the Scriptures.

Remarkable Women

Never before had a distinguished group of Roman women pursued god's Word with such intelligence and enthusiasm. Marcella herself was a person of great intellect who was unafraid to challenge her mentor. When Jerome returned to the desert, she corresponded with him about spiritual matters. He, in turn, described her as the "glory of the ladies of Rome."

In 410, the Goths invaded Rome, led by Alaric. They tortured Marcella to find her riches, which she had long since given to the poor. In an effort to save her companion Principia, Marcella begged for compassion. The soldiers granted the women sanctuary in the church of St. Paul, but it was too late. Weakened by torture, Marcella gave thanks to God as she died in Principia's arms.

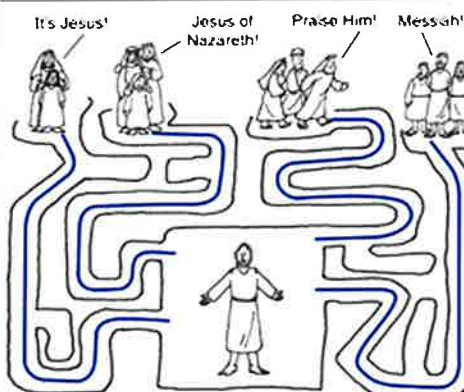
