"Love one another."



The time had come. Jesus had spent so much time teaching his apostles, revealing his Father to them, and preparing them to take this message of salvation to the world. But this was his last night on earth, and he wanted to make his final words to them count. And he did that by distilling all of his wisdom and revelation down into just one "new commandment" (John 13:34).

Love one another (John 13:34). Throughout his ministry, Jesus devoted himself to teaching us how to live together in love. He knew that everything he said and did contributed to this goal. He longed to pull down all the dividing walls that keep us from treating each other as brothers and sisters, created out of love by the same heavenly Father. And now he was about to break the biggest dividing wall: the power of sin.

As I have loved you (John 13:34). All along, Jesus had shown his apostles what love looks

like. He was infinitely patient with their weak faith and their misunderstanding of him. He was constantly urging them to receive his Father's mercy so that they could show mercy to one another. And now he would go so far as to offer his own life on the cross to set them free. *This* is how he loved them: by laying down his life for them. And *this* is how he wants us to love each other: in tangible ways, by pouring ourselves out in love for each other.

Jesus is no longer with us in the same way that he was with his apostles. But he *is* with us through the gift of his Spirit, through our brothers and sisters in Christ, and through his presence in the Eucharist. He is still with us to shower his love on us and to help us love one another in return. So let's turn to him and receive that love. Let's fulfill his new commandment!







Of the Week



Patroness of Desperate Cases

Rita was born in 1377 to elderly parents. From an early age, she wanted to become a nun, but her parents arranged for to marry at age 12. The man they chose for her turned out to be abusive. During their 18 years of marriage, Rita endured his violent temper and watched as her twin sons began to emulate their father.

When her husband was mortally wounded in a brawl, the two boys decided to avenge their father's death. Rita prayed that they would die rather than commit murder.


Her sons fell ill, but through their mother's prayers, they forgave their enemies before they died.


Now a widow, Rita wanted to enter a convent. Because she was not a virgin, Rita had to apply to the Augustinian convent at Cascia three times before being allowed to receive the habit.

Blessed with Stigmata

As a nun, Rita led a life of austerity, prayer and charity. In response to her prayer to suffer as Christ had, Rita received a wound on her forehead as if made by a crown of thorns. It did not heal until she was permitted to visit Rome for the Jubilee of 1450.

Rita became ill with consumption and was eventually confined to bed. Near death, she asked for a rose from her family's garden, even though roses were out of season. A single rose was found and placed on her deathbed. In art, Rita's emblem is the rose, and roses are traditionally blessed on her feast day. Rita was patron of impossible situations (especially matrimonial difficulties), of parenthood and against infertility. She was beatified in 1626 after miraculous cures were attributed to her. Rita was canonized in 1900.


