The 2nd Sunday in Advent

“Repent, for the kingdom of heaven is at hand!”



Today we meet John the Baptist, herald and forerunner of the Messiah. A man of prayer and fasting, John knew from an early age that God had called him to preach repentance and “to give his people knowledge of salvation through the forgiveness of their sins” (Luke 1:76-77)

In the Gospel, John appears in the desert and proclaims, “Repent, for the kingdom of heaven is at hand!” (Matthew 3:2). For years, he has attuned his heart to God’s promptings so he could prepare the people for the Messiah, and now, by the Spirit, he understands that the hour has come! John urges the people to “prepare the way of the Lord,” and get their lives in order so they could welcome Jesus and be saved (3.3).

John’s words cry out in our wilderness today as well: *Prepare the way of the Lord! Repent, and get ready to welcome God’s Son!* Just as the people of John’s time flocked to him to turn away from sin and be baptized, we can return to the Lord this

Advent. We can seize the opportunity to repent and make room for Jesus in our hearts. Then we’ll know the joy of salvation as Jesus releases us from the burden of our sins.

How is God calling you to prepare the way for the Lord today? Don’t let anything prevent you from receiving his hope and healing! Open your heart to the tender mercy of God!

Are you burdened by guilt? Are you struggling to love someone? Or are you so stressed or preoccupied that you can’t even see your need to repent? Jesus delights to offer you absolution in the Sacrament of Reconciliation. He is also present with you right now, wherever you are. He dwells in the sanctuary of your heart, where you can lay bare your sins and receive his mercy. Confess your sins to the Lord today, and you will discover what John knew: Jesus is near; the kingdom is at hand.


Of the Week

## St. Juan Diego Cuauhtlatoatzi

Custodian of a sanctuary

Feast Day: December 9


**H**e was born around 1474, in Cautitlán, which is part of Mexico City today. A member of the Chichimeca people, he was a farmer, a poor subject of the Aztec rulers of the American continent that had not yet encountered European explorers. During his lifetime, however, the country was conquered by Spaniards, and Christianization began, carried out like a political conquest. Bishop Bartolome de Las Casas, an eyewitness, described the conquest of New Spain: "Harm and cruelty, murder and destruction, depopulation, robberies, violence and acts of terror were so frequent and on such a scale... That nothing we have seen before can compare with what was happening here." (Brief Report on the Destruction of Indians").



However, Juan Diego was not discouraged by the religion brought along by the Spaniards. He and his wife Maria Lucia received baptism from Franciscan missionaries in 1524.

### Holy Mother revelations

When five years later Juan's wife died, he started a hermit's life of penance, attending a holy mass in Tepeyac mission every day. On December 9, 1531, while walking to the mass, he saw Mother Mary. Her appearance and clothes were typical for Aztec culture crushed by the white invaders. The revelations lasted until December 12. At the end, an image reflecting the visions appeared on his old coat. This picture has been venerated to present day in Mexico City as the portrait of Our Lady of Guadalupe. At first, no one believed Juan Diego's story. But the local bishop recognized the revelation in 1534. For the rest of his life Juan Diego was a lay custodian in the folk sanctuary that with time has become the biggest Marian shrine in Latin America. Juan Diego was canonized on July 31, 2002.
