The Baptism of the Lord

**“Jesus
came...to be
baptized.”**



Why did Jesus submit to John’s baptism? This cleansing in the waters of the Jordan River was a baptism of repentance (Matthew 3:11). But Jesus was the Son of God—he didn’t need to repent! That’s why John said to the Jesus, “I need to be baptized by you, and yet you are coming to me?” (3:14).

John did not live long enough to witness Jesus’ death and resurrection. But if he had heard Jesus pray, “Father, forgive them,” from the cross, John would have witnessed firsthand the full significance of Jesus’ baptism. Jesus was baptized, not for his own sins, but for ours and those of the whole world.

On the cross, Jesus, the sinless One, would take on the sin of all humanity. As Pope Benedict XVI wrote, when Jesus was baptized, he “loaded the burden of all mankind’s guilt upon his shoulders; he bore it down into the depths of the Jordan. He inaugurated his public activity by

stepping into the place of sinners... The Baptism is an acceptance of death for the sins of humanity” (*Jesus of Nazareth*, p. 18).

That’s why Jesus told John that his baptism would “fulfill all righteousness” (Matthew 3:15). Through Jesus’ death and resurrection, we sinners would be made righteous. Jesus stood with sinners like us along the banks of the Jordan and descended into the waters, just as they had. Then, on the cross, he took on every one of our sins—and put them to death, once and for all.

Today, then is a day to thank the Lord for your own Baptism. Through this great sacrament, you were joined to Jesus in his death and resurrection. You were freed from the burden of guilt that Jesus loaded on his own shoulders. You were cleansed of sin and made righteous. And just as the Father said to Jesus, so he says to you: “You are my beloved child” (see Matthew 3:17). May he forever be praised!

# Why “New Wine”?

The title *New Wine* comes directly from the words of Jesus and points to a core truth of Christian formation: God is always doing something new, and we must be willing to be renewed to receive it.

In the Gospels, Jesus uses the image of wine and wineskins to explain the difference between simply maintaining old structures and allowing true spiritual renewal to take place:

“No one pours new wine into old wineskins. Otherwise, the new wine will burst the skins... Instead, new wine is poured into fresh wineskins.” — *Matthew 9:17*

Wine in Scripture often symbolizes joy, abundance, and the life of God. New wine, then, represents the fresh work of the Holy Spirit—new life in Christ, renewed hearts, and a deeper participation in God’s mission. But Jesus makes clear that new wine requires new wineskins: hearts and minds that are open, formed, and ready to be stretched.

This imagery is echoed throughout the New Testament. At Pentecost, when the disciples are filled with the Holy Spirit and begin to proclaim the Gospel boldly, some observers mockingly say: “They have had too much wine.” — *Acts of the Apostles 2:13*

What looked like chaos was actually transformation. The apostles—once fearful—were becoming courageous witnesses. The Church itself was being born as new wine poured out for the world.


The New Wine Program takes its name from this biblical vision. It is not about discarding tradition or starting from scratch; rather, it is about allowing God to renew the disciple so that the mission of the Church can be carried forward with clarity, faith, and vitality. Formation shapes us into “fresh wineskins”—leaders who are rooted in the faith, attentive to the Holy Spirit, and ready to serve where God calls.

New Wine is ultimately about this question: Are we willing to be renewed so that God can do something new through us?

*Applications are now open for the August 2026 Cohort of the New Wine Program. Those serving in ministry in parishes and schools who feel called to deeper formation and leadership are encouraged to apply. 

# Saint of the Week

## St. Marguerite Bourgeoys

Feast Day: January 12th

Patron of Poverty and Foundress of the Congregation of Natre Dame

**Saint Marguerite Bourgeoys**  
Feast: 12<sup>th</sup> January



### Prayer

God of All, we celebrate the example of the faith of St. Marguerite and how she cared about children and families. Give us the strength to go where we are needed. Help us to make a difference in the lives of others just as she did. May we live the gospel each day. Through your Son, our Lord Jesus Christ. Amen.

The daughter of a candle maker, Marguerite was born outside of Paris in 1620. When she was 20 years old, Marguerite decided to devote her life to Christ and enter a cloistered order. But both the Carmelites and the Poor Clares turned her down. The local clergy told her that the rejections were signs from God that she was more suited to living in an unenclosed religious community.

Later, when the governor of Ville-Marie in Canada was visiting France, he met Marguerite and offered her the position of schoolmistress in his colony. She accepted and sailed to Canada in 1653. Reaching Ville-Marie a few weeks later, Marguerite found about 200 people living at the fort and a church where a Jesuit missionary priest ministered. Marguerite knew that this was her destiny.

For the first four years, Marguerite looked after children and devoted her time to helping in the local hospital. In 1658, she turned a converted stable into a school, the first of many she was to found. As the school grew, she returned to France to hire more teachers. Twelve women accepted the challenge of teaching in the New World.


### Acceptance in the New World

After the end of the Iroquois War in 1667, the colony expanded and became known as Montreal. Marguerite taught adopted Indian children and added a kindergarten to the school. Her unenclosed religious community was now in full swing and was canonically erected as the Congregation of Notre Dame in 1676.

After retiring at the age of 73, Marguerite prayed that God would take her life instead of that of a young teacher who was gravely ill. The teacher's health improved and Marguerite died just a few days later.


