***“The kingdom
of heaven
is like a
mustard seed.”***



In his parables, Jesus often made use of familiar, everyday objects to capture his listeners' imagination and help them see God's work from a new perspective. In today's Gospel, he uses a tiny mustard seed to illustrate the surprising nature of God's kingdom. "It is the smallest of all the seeds, yet....becomes a large bush, and the 'birds of the sky come and dwell in its branches'" (Matthew 13:32). Great things, Jesus is saying, can come from small beginnings.

We see this principle play out in the history of the Church. From their hiding place in the upper room, Jesus' disciples took the message of his resurrection to the whole world. Through the power of the Spirit and the preaching of those first apostles, the Church grew—and continues to grow—in phenomenal ways.

Sometimes, though, God's work may have such tiny, unimpressive beginnings and grow so slowly that we barely notice it. This tends to be true in our spiritual lives, too. That kind of

growth is often hidden, like the yeast that the woman put into "three measures" of flour (Matthew 13:33). We may not see dramatic signs of Christian maturity in ourselves or our loved ones right away. On the contrary, it can be easy to spot the "weeds" in our lives and our world that seem to take root and grow so quickly. And that can be discouraging!

That's why Jesus encourages us to remember the mustard seed. He wants us to trust in the goodness of the seed of faith he has placed within us and in his Church. He wants us to keep looking for the green shoots of his kingdom. And he wants us to keep asking for the grace to nurture their growth in ourselves and the people around us.

So don't worry! God's work often starts off small and slow. He is faithful, and his seed will bear fruit!

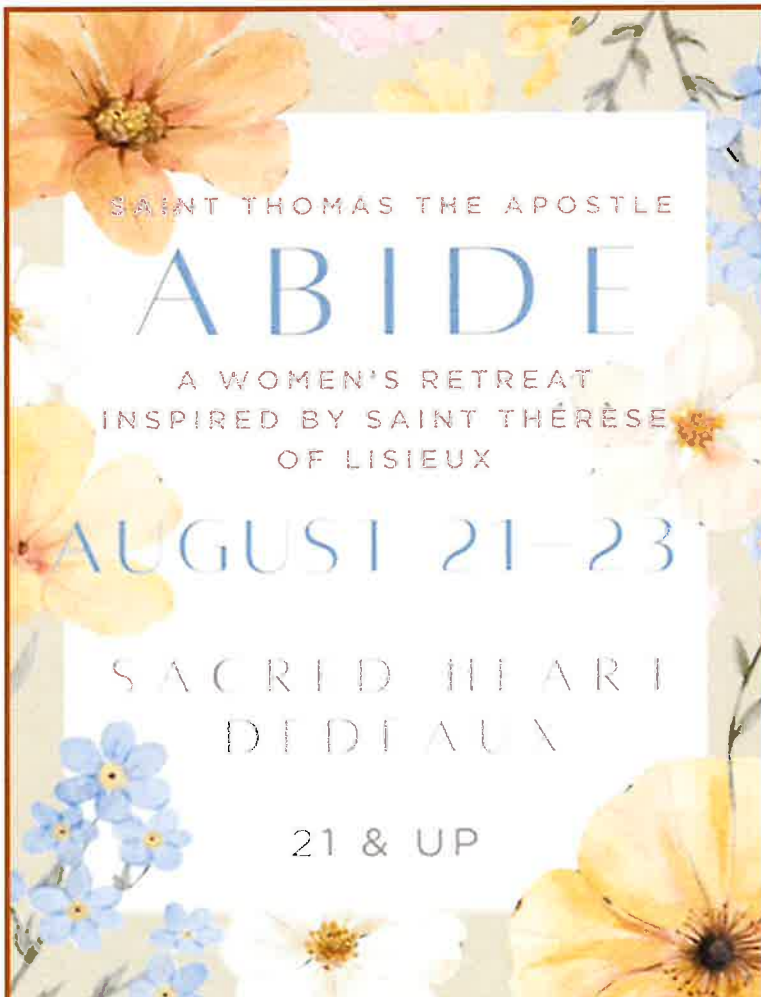

# Saint John Lloyd

Feast Day: July 22

One of the 40 Martyrs of England and Wales



Around 1630, John Lloyd was born in South Wales. Drawn to the priesthood as a young man, John left his home to enter the monastery at Valladolid, Spain. He was ordained in 1653, and the next year, he returned to his homeland as a missionary.

For the next two decades, John served his fellow Welsh Catholics. During that time, Catholics in England and Wales faced persecution for their faith under several Protestant governments. The intensity of the attacks increased in 1678, when false rumors were spread about a Catholic plot to massacre members of Parliament. John was targeted for arrest, with a bounty placed on his head. But his loyal parishioners refused to reveal that he was secretly celebrating Mass, which was a crime at the time.

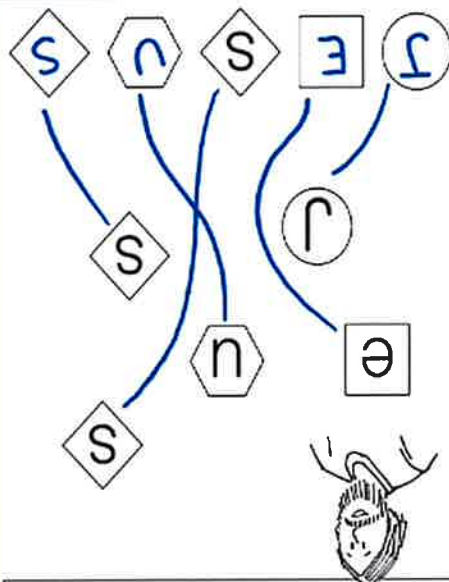
## *Tried and Convicted*

John was arrested in November 1678 and brought to Cardiff, the capital of Wales. His trial began the following May, but the authorities became frustrated by their inability to find witnesses to accuse him.

Eventually, as a last resort, the authorities bribed two poor women to testify against John. The women falsely stated that they had attended one of his Masses, and John was subsequently convicted and sentenced to hang.

## *Faithful to the End*

On the execution day, John cited the words of Jesus: "Blessed are they who are persecuted for the sake of righteousness, for theirs is the kingdom of heaven." (Matthew 5:10) John was beatified in 1929, and then canonized in 1970 by Pope Paul VI as one of the 40 Martyrs of England and Wales.
